## OUR MISSION

Outreach Aid to the Americas exists to effectively mobilize resources and partners for relief and preparedness, advocacy, and sustainable development.

## WHAT WE DO

OAA has impacted over 200,000 people directly through these goals across countries like Cuba, Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and El Salvador. Our approach is rooted in collaboration, trust, and local relevance, ensuring that every program is tailored to the context and built to last.

Over the last five years, Outreach Aid to the Americas (OAA) has directly served more than 189,000 individuals across six countries in Latin America and the Caribbean—Cuba, the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua—through integrated programs focused on humanitarian relief, civic engagement, and economic empowerment.

In Cuba, OAA launched four flagship programs that trained over 825 entrepreneurs and 100 youth leaders, establishing microenterprises, youth-led community initiatives, and social enterprises, with a strong focus on Afro-Cuban, women, and faith-based groups.

In the Dominican Republic, OAA empowered 20 single women and new mothers—many of whom are the primary breadwinners for their families—through its Business in a Box program. This new economic stability has enabled them to cover essential household expenses and invest in their children’s well-being. In parallel, OAA provided educational support to over 200 children in remote communities, ensuring access to learning opportunities. The majority of these businesses are currently active and growing under ongoing mentorship.

In response to food insecurity, disasters, and displacement, OAA delivers large-scale relief programs including food, hygiene kits, and emergency assistance. At the same time, we help communities build long-term resilience through training, preparedness, and economic self-sufficiency.





## PROMOTE HUMAN RIGHTS AND CIVIC PARTICIPATION

Especially in restrictive environments, OAA supports programs that teach democratic values, freedom of religion or belief, and human rights. We promote active citizenship and empower communities to participate in shaping their future.

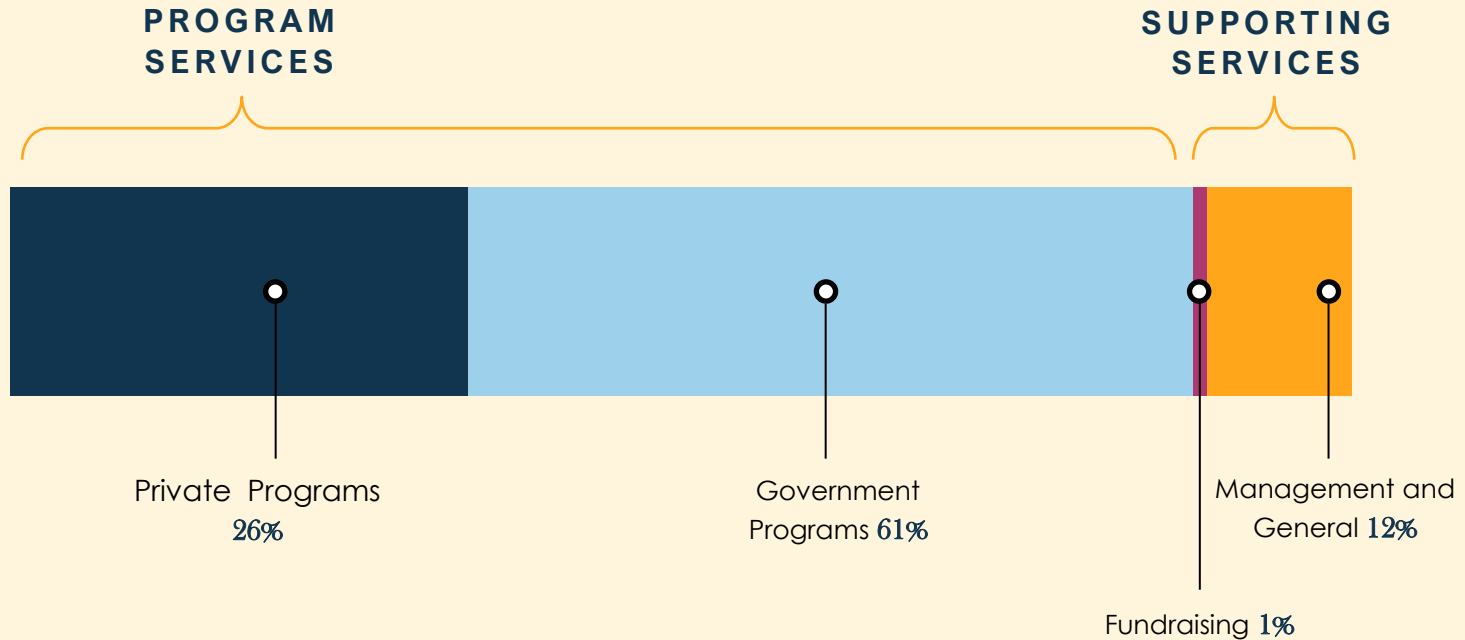
